MEG Bird Group

Melton Environment Group Bird Walks in 2020 will be held on the 3rd Saturday of the month, to avoid conflicting with other local walks. MEG walks (including bushland walks) are easy walking & child friendly, on defined paths, with no bushwalking skills required. MEG bird walks begin at 9.00. Details of birds seen are placed on eBird as a record of bird diversity in Melton MEG Bird Walks will be coordinated with those of Eynesbury Environment Group to avoid dates clashing.

Walks in bushland will be automatically cancelled on Total Fire Ban Days, in high dangerous winds or lightning activity.

21st March Eynesbury

Eynesbury is a 200 hectare Grey Box Woodland with over 150 bird species observed so far, as well as a small ornamental lake rich in wetland birdlife. Toilet facilities, general store, restaurant & bar! On Fire Ban Days, walk will be around the lake only. Eynesbury Discovery Centre Melway 226 Ref H1

18th April Little Blind Creek

Little Blind Creek flows through Melton, meeting Toolern Creek at Hannah Watts Park. It is home for large numbers of birds. Meet in Guide Hall carpark in Pinkerton St (off Yuille St opposite Melton Golf Course). Melway Map 337 Ref C8

16th May Melton Botanic Garden

Melton Botanic Garden features plants that tolerate a dry climate and low water conditions. Corner of Tullidge Street and Williams Street. Melways Map 337 Ref: C10 and D10

20th June Hannah Watts

Hannah Watts Park is a popular park, beside Toolern Creek, in High St, just east of the shopping centre, opposite the golf course. Melway Page 337 Ref D9

18th July Toolern Creek (Big Red)

There is a footpath that runs along the creek. The creek forms a wildlife corridor through Melton, from Toolern Vale in the north to the Toolern Regional Park in the south, thence to the Werribee River. Mel way Ref 337 C9

15th August Strathtulloh Woodland

Strathtulloh Woodland is a remnant regenerating Grey Box Woodland overlooking Toolern Creek Meet in Strathtulloh Circuit Melway 343 Ref A12

19th September Melton Gilgai Woodland

Melton Gilgai (Harkness Road Woodland) Remnant Grey Box/ Yellow Gum woodland Meet in Harkness Road Melway 330 Ref B11

17th October Eynesbury

Eynesbury Discovery Centre Melway 226 Ref H1

21st November Long Forest Mallee

Long Forest Mallee (LFM) is a unique Mallee remnant between Melton & Bacchus Marsh. Long Forest Road Melway 335 Ref E3

Pinkerton Landcare & Environment Group

Pinkerton Landcare & Environment Group (PLEG) invite the community to join them birding at Pinkerton Forest & Mulla Mulla Woodland (Bush's Paddock) in the morning. Previously these walks were hosted by Birdlife Australia's Werribee Wagtails, but since the demise of the Werribee Wagtails they will now be hosted by PLEG.

Note: no footpaths- walking is through the bush!

The group will then proceed to Eynesbury Forest in the afternoon

BYO lunch, drinks & snacks. Toilets & coffee shop at Eynesbury (composting toilet at Pinkerton).

About 127 bird species have been recorded at Pinkerton & about 150 at Eynesbury to date. Wedge-tailed Eagles regularly nest in these woodlands. These quarterly surveys provide valuable data as to both bird diversity & numbers in these woodlands. Citizen science in action!

Pinkerton is private property located at athttp://goo.gl/maps/drFnS. As you drive up Mt Cottrell Road from Werribee there is a group of houses on the left. The gravel track to Pinkerton (behind a locked gate) is just before the first house (1668 Mt Cottrell Road). Mulla Mulla Grassland (formerly Bush's Paddock) is accessed by the same track.
